# **Deccan Festival**

Dive into culture, art and music at the Deccan Festival, an extravaganza of cultural events over five days. This festival is held in the historic and fascinating Qutub Shahi Tombs in Hyderabad, a truly unique location. This annual celebration sees the whole city come alive as it celebrates its rich Deccan roots. Travellers will have a chance to experience authentic ghazals, qawalis and mushairas (poetry sessions) and popular singers and dancers from around the world. Artists and craftsmen come from around the country to sell artwork, pearls, jewellery and accessories, while local chefs whip up specialist dishes from the Nawabi region, giving the festival the feeling of a bustling bazaar.

# Taj Mahotsav, Agra

# **Pushkar Camel Fair**

Held each November at the time of the Kartik Purnima full moon, Pushkar Camel Fair is one of India's greatest spectacles, it's a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for travellers to witness the colour, spectacle and carnival of one of the last great traditional melas. The festival attracts over 300,000 people and up to 20,000 camels, cattle and horses. Visitors will witness impressive bartering as 100,000's of camels are sold, as well as fun events such as the "matka phod", "longest moustache", and "bridal competition". It's Crufts for camels! In recent years the fair has also included an exhibition cricket match between the local Pushkar club and a team of willing tourists.
