New Zealand has long been one of the most popular gap year destinations, offering both a 23 month working holiday visa for those who want to stay a little longer and a compact and diverse country of incredible landscapes and adrenalin thrills, all easily explored on an epic road trip adventure.

From a 'battle of the buns' burger contest in Wellington and the chance to pedal your way around the craft breweries in Nelson, to trying your hand at the new craze of 'zurfing' or following in the footsteps of the England cricket team, New Zealand has a few surprises up its sleeve for those on the adventure of a lifetime this year.

PEDAL YOUR WAY TO A PINT

New Zealand's wine rightly garners international attention and no trip is complete without a trip to a few cellar doors. Less well known is New Zealand's burgeoning craft beer scene giving visitors the chance to refine their beer tasting skills with a growing range of craft brewery tours. With more craft breweries per head of the population than anywhere else in the country, Nelson is establishing itself as somewhat of a Mecca for hop lovers. Gentle Cycling offers guided cycling tours, giving beer lovers the chance to combine eating local produce with a bike tour of craft breweries such as Bays Brewery and Lighthouse Brewery and to taste the likes of Bays Devon Stout, Rhino Ale and Windfall Cider. The beer doesn't stop flowing in the North Island either as Wellington's Pete Gillespie and Jos Ruffell have created The Garage Project, brewing 24 different beers in 24

days including the famous Cockswain's Courage brew, which won silver at the prestigious Beer World Cup. Head to the Garage Project Cellar Door to try some of their exclusive beers including the Umami Monster, the almost pitch black beer brewed with seaweed, fish extract and sea water.

FROM ZURFING TO ZIPLINING IN ROTORUA

Zorbing (the Kiwi invention of rolling down a slope in an inflatable hamster ball like contraption) is having an upgrade. It's now all about zurfing, the ultimate on-land surfboard-like experience and the latest craze to hit Rotorua - perfect for adventurers and thrill seekers. Using a water-filled Zydro zorb, participants use a specially developed body board to surf their way down the slopes and replicate the sensation of surfing. Skyline has also launched Zoom Zipline, a thrilling high-speed twin zipline that descends 383 metres down the side of Mount Ngongotaha, dropping a total of 48 vertical metres at a speed of 80km/h. Guests will have spectacular views over Lake Rotorua as they fly 450 metres above sea level. Still up for more? Canopy Tours recently launched a unique and inspiring adventure, Creatures of the Night. Departing at dusk, guests will be taken on a guided ziplining tour through the forest where it is not uncommon to see a range of insects unique to New Zealand including Weta, Morepork and glow worms. Standing on the highest platform situated 22 metres above the forest floor, guests can launch themselves into the darkness under the clear night sky for a truly unique experience.

WILD CAMPING - DOC LAUNCHES NEW PASS

For the true nature lovers, The Department of Conservation (DOC) has launched a new weekly campsite pass. This pass is valid for up to a year and gives the flexibility to pay once and stay up to seven nights at 100 different DOC campsites around New Zealand, from the Kapowairua Spirits Bay campsite in Kaitaia to the Kumeti campsite in Hawke's Bay. Stand out spots include Uretiti in the Whangarei area in the North Island, offering campers the chance to camp behind sand dunes at Uretiti Beach and explore the nearby Waipu caves. In the South Island, head to Butchers Flat, which was once a gold mining site and close to Mount Richmond Forest Park, perfect for long nature walks. For those who fancy a bit more luxury, glamping options are also available from the Hot Water Beach campsite in Te Rata Bay or Pelorus Bridge campsite in the Marlborough region.

BE THE FIRST IN THE WORLD TO SEE IN THE NEW YEAR AT RHYTHM AND VINES, GISBORNE
