From Bali to New Zealand, here's a round up of the best activities best enjoyed in the dark...

STARLIGHT SPA AT ALILA UBUD, BALI

Alila Ubud in Bali puts a whole new spin on natural spa treatments with 'Moonlight Remedies'. The two-hour treatment takes place outside after dark, amid the lush green surroundings of the resort's Sculpture Garden on the banks of the magical Ayung River. It's believed that a new or full moon is when the moon's energy is at its strongest, therefore the treatment is conducted outdoors in a custom spa tent. Open to nature yet completely private, the treatment harnesses good lunar energy to promote healing and spiritual growth, while encouraging complete mind and body relaxation. African landscape so guests are able to spot big game during the day and focus in on the brightly lit stars at night. As there is no light pollution, the high-performing telescopes offer a rare opportunity to see clearly for hundreds of miles in every direction.

TORCH LIT DESCENTS AND TOBOGGANING IN THE DARK WITH POWDER WHITE

The fun doesn't stop when the sun goes down on the slopes. In Val d'Isere guests can huddle on the slopes with a vin chaud as they watch the impressive and magical sight of ski instructors making a torch lit descent down La Face. The torch lit descent is always followed by a stunning firework display. In Courchevel once the skiing stops you can hop onto a toboggan for an exhilarating sledging run that starts in 1850 and ends in 1550. The run is 2km long, with 300m of vertical with an average incline of 15%. The run is floodlit from start to finish, allowing for evening descents. Top tip, wear goggles, otherwise a face full of snow may reduce chances of winning!

TAKE YOUR STARGAZING TO ANOTHER LEVEL IN ONE OF THE WORLD'S ONLY INTERNATIONAL DARK SKY RESERVES

New Zealand is home to one of just five international Dark Sky Reserves (and the only one in the Southern Hemisphere) making it the perfect destination for a holiday under the night skies. Head to Aoraki Mackenzie, a gold rated dark sky reserve, almost completely free of light pollution and located in the Mackenzie Basin, in the stunning South Island of New Zealand. The 4300 sqkm area includes Aoraki Mt Cook National Park, and the villages of Lake Tekapo, Twizel and Mt Cook, bounded by a spectacular alpine landscape with the Southern Alps in the west, and the Two Thumb Range in the east. Stargazing opportunities are endless – from guided tours of the solar system and visits to world-class observatories, to a visit to the world's southernmost planetarium at the Hillary Alpine Centre.

HOW: Earth and Sky (www.earthandskynz.com) offer Night Time Tours of the famous Mount John Observatory with the chance to see the Southern night skies through world-class telescopes, including the country's biggest, which spans 1.8 metres. Stay in the heart of the reserve at The Hermitage Hotel (www.hermitage.co.nz), with views over Mount Cook and head out on a stargazing 'safari' with Big Sky Stargazing. Alternatively, head to the wilds for a night under the stars in the Department of Conservation 'White Horse Hill' campsite, set
