The Rolling Stones, Auckland, 22nd November 2014

To celebrate the 50th anniversary since The Rolling Stones first performed in New Zealand, the rock legends will head to Auckland as part of the 'Stones on Fire' tour, starting in November around Asia and Australasia. Stones fans will once again have the chance to experience the band's classic hits such as 'Gimme Shelter', 'Paint It Black' and 'Jumping Jack Flash'.
