Puck Fair, Killorglin, 10th - 12th August

The Puck Fair is one of Ireland's most unusual street festivals; where a wild mountain goat is crowned King of the town for three days and nights - it's a 'see it to believe it' moment! At 400 years old, Puck Fair is one of Ireland's oldest festivals; staging unique parades and ceremonies, providing free concerts, dance workshops, storytelling, fireworks, pet shows and puppet theatres - all part of the 36 hours of free entertainment.
